#### Letter from Our Board

First and foremost, we wish to heartily thank our donors and prayer partners for their support during this difficult year. The COVID pandemic has limited much of what we could do in 2020. Requirements of social distancing closed the William G. Hempel Seafarer's Center and, until recently, seafarers have not been able to leave their ships. Because of these restrictions, we have not been able to transport them to stores or other venues for needed personal supplies.

Looking ahead, we have updated our services to keep everyone safe and effective as we provide for our visiting seafarers, now and after the pandemic. We are working with agents of shipping companies that send vessels to the Port of Albany. Our mutual efforts have created a notifications system that alerts us to the arrival time and docking location of ships coming to the Capital District. Second, we will soon bring hospitality bags to every seafarer who needs it, especially those who cannot leave their ship. At least one volunteer will be available every day of the week so that every ship can be contacted and welcomed. This hospitality service will begin after Christmastide when we are stocked with needed supplies.

Through your generously, we have been able to continue one of our most cherished traditions. Our volunteers are giving Christmas at Sea boxes to every seafarer who arrives during the Christmas season. The Seafarer's appreciate the boxes and look forward to coming to Albany during the holidays.
